

# DEGREE COMPLETION PROGRAM INTERDISCIPLINARY STUDIES

BACHELOR OF ART

The MCLA Degree Completion Program is designed for students seeking a non-traditional pathway to completing a bachelor's degree. Students begin their course of study with a group of their peers and proceed through the program together. Classes are offered in the evenings and online to help students meet the demands of work, family, and their studies.

- Cohort-style learning provides peer support for students who are managing work and family demands.
- Acceptance to the program requires an associate degree or 45 to 75 transfer credits, and a minimum 2.0 GPA.
- Classes are offered in Pittsfield and online.
- 7 week sessions meetings one night per week.
- Opportunity to earn credit for life and work experience.
- Financial aid is available to those who qualify.

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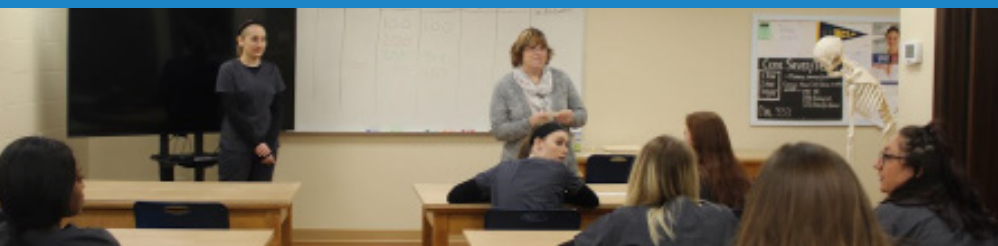
